His main focus was repairing magnetos used for the primary ignition system in the oil well industry. Fast forward a century and the company switched gears slightly and is now the largest Axalta paint distributor and hydraulic/industrial hose shop in the Southern Tier.




Hill to give keynote at 2018 Nonprofit Networking Day
