

This publication serves as a one-stop information source filled with details about the Chamber, member benefits, and its members that make #AHOP the very special community that it is.



MARCH 20: THE HIDDEN WORLD OF A VERNAL POND, Pfeiffer Nature Center, Lillibridge Property, Portville, 10 to 11 a.m. OR 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Every year at the end of winter, the snow begins to melt, temperatures begin to increase, and the forest begins to start its spring transformation. As the snow melts, there is an excessive amount of water creating these small, isolated ponds in any depression or low area on the forest floor. This results in the creation of vernal ponds, temporary pools that exist in the spring and dry up in the summer. Join presenter, Brandon Witmer, as he leads us on a walk to explore these hidden worlds, learn about their importance, and find the small creatures that rely on these pools year after year.
